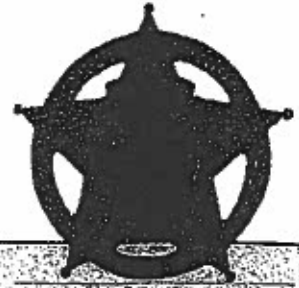

SYNOPSIS:

On June 16, 2019 at approximately 0323 hours, South Bend Police (SBPD) Officers were dispatched to 110 N. William Street in South Bend, Indiana (Central High Apartments) for a suspicious person. The dispatcher further advised that there was a subject in the north parking lot, wearing all dark clothing with a flashlight, possibly breaking out windows.

Sergeant Ryan O'Neill, working as unit #331 arrived on scene first. He notified dispatch his arrival at approximately 03:30:32 hours. Then at approximately 03:31:55, Sgt. O'Neill notified dispatch, "shots fired, get me an ambo (ambulance)". Sergeant O'Neill further advised that the guy threw a knife at him. Sergeant O'Neill continued to direct dispatch to get him an "ambo" there. At approximately 03:34:00 Officers advised that they were going to load and go. SBPD Officer, Aaron Knepper transported the individual, who was later identified as Eric Logan to the 615 N. Michigan Street (Memorial Hospital). They arrived at the hospital at approximately 03:36:19 hours.

Due to the officer involvement in the shooting, per protocol, the St. Joseph County Metro Homicide Unit (MHU) was contacted to take over the investigation. Eric Logan ultimately died later on from the injuries sustained.

Sergeant O'Neill later reported that he located Logan while driving through the parking lot. He stated that Logan had his upper torso inside of a black Honda Civic. Sergeant O'Neill then questioned the individual about a purse that was shoved into Logan's sweatshirt. Once Sergeant O'Neill questioned him about the purse, Logan squared up and at that time Sergeant O'Neill noticed a knife in his hand. Logan then raised the knife over his head and moved towards Sergeant O'Neill. Sergeant O'Neill then retreated backwards towards his issued police car until he started running out of room to retreat. Sergeant O'Neill then reportedly shot two times, striking Logan once in the upper left side of his torso. Logan then threw the knife at Sergeant O'Neill, striking him in the left arm in which he had positioned up holding his flashlight.

June 16, 2019 (Sunday):

At approximately 0408 hours I received a phone call from the St. Joseph County Communication Center about the officer involved shooting at Central High Apartments. I immediately started getting ready and I left to start investigating. I stopped by the scene and gathered more information from SBPD Officers conducting scene security, learning that the incident took place in the parking lot. At this time it was raining outside. I then drove to 523 E. Jefferson Boulevard (MHU Office). Upon arrival I met with other MHU Investigators and we consulted about the incident.

After gathering information about the case, my MHU partner, Detective Karch and I loaded in the MHU Crime Scene Truck and left for the scene. We arrived on scene at approximately 0502 hours. Upon arrival it had just stopped raining. A perimeter had been established with William Street blocked off with traffic cones and crime scene tape from Washington Street (South) to Lincoln Way W. (North) and Colfax Avenue was blocked off from Michigan Street (east) to Taylor Street (West). Also, there was an inner perimeter established with crime scene tape around the North parking lot of Central High Apartments. There were several SBPD Officers conducting scene security.

We parked the MHU Crime Scene Truck on William Street on the west side of the perimeter. We entered the scene and conducted an initial walkthrough to determine the scene elements, locate any physical evidence, and plan a processing strategy. Let it be known that nothing is moved or collected during the walkthrough procedure, it is just for observation purposes only.

I immediately noticed a car stereo faceplate and broken pieces appearing to be from it laying on the roadway on William Street, just west of the north parking lot at Central High Apartments. I also noticed a blue 2006 Scion TC (Plate # [REDACTED]) parked on William Street on the east side of the road, facing north. The Scion had a shattered front driver's window. The window had plastic covering taped over the window. The owner of the vehicle, [REDACTED] was at the scene. I first asked [REDACTED] if anything was taken from his vehicle in which he didn't believe anything was stolen. I then asked [REDACTED] if he heard or saw anything, in which he replied that he didn't. For further information on the damage for the blue Scion see SBPD case #19-8533.

Next, I noticed several surveillance cameras affixed to the exterior of Central High Apartments. [REDACTED] provided me with the phone number for [REDACTED]

who is the Apartment Manager (██████████) for Central High Apartments. I facilitated contact with ██████████ over the phone and later in person. ██████████ stated that the cameras are inoperable. She further stated that the apartment went through renovations approximately five years ago and they cut the cords for the surveillance cameras and never hooked them back up.

I continued to the north parking lot at Central High Apartments. I noticed a black Honda Civic facing west, parked in the parking lot. The black Honda was parked in the third row from the west and the second parking spot from the south. I noticed the front driver's side door was opened up and there were several personal items on the asphalt behind the vehicle. Those items included a purse, change, keys, and several miscellaneous cords. There were two SBPD squad cars parked behind the black Civic to the east. The closest vehicle was SBPD car #3020 (Plate #17705) and is issued to Sergeant Ryan O'Neill. Car #3020 was parked facing southwesterly and was just southeast of the black Civic. The other SBPD squad car was car #752 (plate #20260) and is issued to Officer Benjamin Canarecci. Car #752 was facing southwesterly and was parked northeast of the black Civic and behind car #3020.

SBPD Officers had placed down four evidence markers (EM 1-4), marking evidence prior to my arrival. Those items were:

- EM 1) A spent cartridge case with head stamp "FC 9mm LUGER" located just north of SBPD car #3020
- EM 2) A spent cartridge case with head stamp "FC 9mm LUGER" located just northwest of SBPD car #3020
- EM 3) A Gerber brand fixed blade knife with a black and gray handle located near the back passenger side wheel of SBPD car #3020. The knife also had a broken tip on it.
- EM 4) A tan colored purse located just south of SBPD car #3020

The evidence markers for these items were later changed out with our own evidence markers, but items 1-4 were left in the same order.

There was a white Subaru Forester parked in the parking spot directly south of the black Civic. The white Forester had red stains on the rear hatchback door on the driver's side.

I continued down several parking spaces to the north from the black Civic and noticed a white Toyota Highlander (also parked facing west) with a shattered front passenger window. It was later

discovered that this vehicle belonged to [REDACTED], who had several personal items stolen from inside her vehicle. See SBPD case #19-8533 for further details.

I continued to check other vehicles in the parking lot, but did not locate any other vehicles with damage. It was unknown at that time if any more cars in the parking lot were left unlocked were entered without permission.

Next, I checked the cars parked on William Street between Washington Street and Colfax Avenue. I then noticed a blue Mercury Grand Marquis with both its passenger side doors slightly ajar. The blue Grand Marquis was parked on the west side of William Street, facing south, near Washington Street directly in front of the east side door entrance to 501 W. Washington Street (Rushton Apartments). I then noticed in plain view that the stereo faceplate was missing from the vehicle. A short period later, the owner to the vehicle, [REDACTED] spoke to me through a window at the apartments. I informed her that someone possibly broke in her vehicle and had possibly stolen items from it. I had her come out and look in the vehicle and see if anything was missing. [REDACTED] stated that her stereo faceplate was missing and that she had left her vehicle unlocked. I also, asked [REDACTED] if I could dust the vehicle for finger prints. I later located a print on the trim of the rear passenger door.

Next, we documented the scene with digital photography and digital video. Upon completion we searched for evidence. We marked with evidence markers (EM), documented, and collected the following items of evidence:

- **Item #1)** A spent cartridge case with head stamp "FC 9mm LUGER" located just north of SBPD car #3020 at EM #1
- **Item #2)** A spent cartridge case with head stamp "FC 9mm LUGER" located just northwest of SBPD car #3020 at EM #2
- **Item #3)** A Gerber brand fixed blade knife with a black and gray handle located near the back passenger side wheel of SBPD car #3020 at EM #3. The knife also had a broken tip on it. The knife was later identified as belonging to Evan [REDACTED]
- **Item #4)** A tan colored purse located just south of SBPD car #3020 at EM #4. The purse was later identified as belonging to Katy [REDACTED]
- **Item #5)** A white tissue type material saturated from the rain located between the black Civic and SBPD car #3020. We were later informed that this tissue was dropped by Eric

Logan during the incident. Furthermore, the tissue possibly had blood on it and was covering a cut on Logan's hand.

- **Item #6)** A white phone with a black a black case and several cords located just east of the black Civic at EM #6. This phone was later identified as belonging to Eric Logan.
- **Item #7)** A pink wallet containing an ID and cards in the name of Katy [REDACTED] along with some U.S. Currency coins located just east of the white Subaru at EM #7. Also, a set of keys were originally collected with item #7, but we were later informed by Katy [REDACTED] that the keys were not hers so the keys were separated and packaged as item #13.
- **Item #8)** Four swabs of red stain taken from the hatchback of the white Subaru Forester at EM #8.
- **Item #9)** A car stereo faceplate located on William Street west of the north parking lot at Central High Apartments at EM #9. The faceplate was later identified as belonging to Leigh [REDACTED]
- **Item #10)** A black in color rectangular piece of trim, possibly from the stereo faceplate (item #9) located on the sidewalk near the blue Grand Marquis at EM #10.

Detective Karch and I used a tape measure to measure the distance from area just outside the front driver's door of the black Honda Civic to the back tire of SBPD car #2030. It showed a total distance of approximately 23 feet. Detective Karch documented this with digital photography.

Next, we located a perforating bullet defect on the bottom corner of the unhinged side of the front driver's door of the black Honda Civic. The defects were labeled with gray scales and marked as D-1 and D-2. The characteristics of the defects are as follows:

- **D-1)** D-1 is consistent with being an entry defect in the weather stripping on the inside of the bottom unhinged corner of the front driver's door of the black Honda Civic. The characteristics of the defect are consistent with being an entry due to the defect being circular in shape, the materials flowing inward, and the exiting characteristics to Defect D-2 flowing outward.
- **D-2)** D-2 is consistent with being an exit defect in the exterior of the bottom unhinged side corner of the front driver's door of the black Honda Civic. The characteristics of the defect are consistent with being an exit due to it being irregular in shape and the metal materials are flowing outward.

The characteristics of the defects are consistent with entering through the interior weather stripping at D-1 on the bottom unhinged corner of the driver's door, striking the inside of the door and exiting the exterior of the door at D-2. I placed a flight path rod through the defect but due to the large irregularity of the exit defect and the door being moveable, I was unable to secure the flight path rod in place and get an accurate angle of incidence. However, I did locate a small defect in the pavement under the front passenger tire of the white Subaru Forester. I then searched underneath the white Subaru and located 2 bullet fragments underneath it (items 11 and 12). I later had the vehicle owner move his vehicle in order to search more thoroughly. I inspected the tread on the tires of the vehicle and area underneath after it was moved, but did not locate any more ballistic evidence.

After the rain on the black Honda Civic dried, I dusted the front driver's door area for finger prints, but did not locate any.

Lastly, Commander Grzegorek arrived along with Sergeant O'Neill to complete a video walkthrough of the incident. I video recorded the walkthrough of the incident. See the video for further detail.

Upon completion, Det. Karch and I completed a final walkthrough of the scene. We left the scene at approximately 0932 hours, returned to MHU, secured the evidence in a locked and alarmed evidence room, and uploaded the digital evidence to the MHU server.

June 17, 2019 (Monday):

On this day I met with several theft victims at the MHU Office. I first met with Katy [REDACTED] arrived to identify items stolen from her white Toyota Highlander. Katy identified the tan purse (item #4) and the pink wallet (item #7) as being hers. She stated that the keys along with a black audio cord collected with the pink wallet were not hers. The keys (item #13) and audio cord (item #14) were then re-cataloged into evidence.

Shortly after meeting with Katy, Evan [REDACTED] arrived to identify items stolen from his Honda CRV. Evan Lives at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and reported two speedway cards and 2 knives stolen from his car. See SBPD case #19-8558 for further details. Evan identified the Gerber fixed blade knife (item #3) as being his. He stated that the knife did not have a broken tip, last he seen it. Also, he stated that the knife was in a sheath when it was in his car.

Later in the day, Leigh [REDACTED] arrived at MHU to identify items stolen from her blue Mercury Grand Marquis. Leigh identified the stereo faceplate (item #9) as hers. I then asked Leigh if she would allow me to search for fingerprints in and on her car in which she agreed. I dusted for fingerprints and located a latent print on the back side of the chrome trim to the rear passenger door. Further note, this door was found ajar at the scene. I lifted the print and collected it as evidence (item #16)

I learned through discussion with Leigh [REDACTED] that there are cameras inside 501 W. Washington Street and one outside on the south side of the building. Additionally, I learned that Eric Logan was residing in that apartment complex with a relative. I facilitated contact with the Director of Property Management, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and discussed the video surveillance with her. She reported that the surveillance cameras are activated through motion sensors. I had her check the cameras around the time frame of the incident, but there were no recordings around the time of the incident. I later contacted her about the cameras again on June 21, 2019 and asked if I could view them. Mary facilitated me getting access to the cameras through the internet cloud through the Rushton apartments SmartOffice Account. She added me to the account and emailed me the link. After logging in I had full access to their camera system. There were no recordings close before and around the time of the shooting. The last motion censored activation prior to the incident occurred at 11:13:09 PM on 6/15/2019. I viewed all the motion activated recording segments from 2000 hours on June 15 until 0400 hours on June 16. I did not view any recordings that had Eric Logan in them in that time frame.

When we were at the crime scene we collected a white LG cell phone (item 36) in the parking lot. Due to the phone being rained on, I placed it in Laboratory fume hood to dry the device. Once dried, I powered on the device and used it to contact 911 in order to locate a phone number and the

name of the owner. The dispatcher reported that the phone number to the phone is (574)274-9156. We checked the phone through Accurint and the phone number returned to Eric Logan. I later placed the phone into airplane mode and plugged it in to the charger.

June 18, 2019 (Tuesday):

On this date I completed a Digital Examination Request Form for a phone extraction for the white LG cell phone (item #6) and submitted it to Cyber Crimes. Upon approval of the request, I delivered the LG cell phone and a flash drive to Cyber Crimes Investigator, Laura Hernandez at 306 Hammes Mowbray Hall, Notre Dame, Indiana. I met with Investigator Hernandez later in the day and collected the phone along with the flash drive, which contained the phone extraction on it.

Also, on this day I completed an SBPD Lab request for a ballistics examination and submitted all the ballistic items to Ray Wolfenbarger of the SBPD Crime Laboratory. See the lab request and Wolfenbarger's analysis for further details.

Next, I completed an Indiana State Police (ISP) Laboratory Request for a DNA and Fingerprint Examination. Detective Karch submitted the items to the ISP Lowell Laboratory on June 20, 2019. See the lab request and ISP analysis for further details.

June 19, 2019 (Wednesday)

On this day I facilitated contact with all the victims that identified items being stolen from their vehicles in order to get permission to obtain buccal swabs from them as elimination standards. They all agreed to submit to buccal swabs.

I along with Detective Cook first met with Leigh [REDACTED] at her apartment complex located at [REDACTED]. I first had her read the Consent to Search form. After agreeing to the consent and signing the form, I placed on a new pair of latex gloves and collected buccal swabs from her.

After meeting with Leigh, Detective Cook and I decided to search several blocks around the area around of the shooting incident for any more evidence and video footage. We diligently searched for evidence and stopped at several businesses on William Street, Taylor Street, and Washington Street, but were unsuccessful in locating any more evidence. We then went to Central High Apartments and met with Apartment Manager, [REDACTED]. We asked if she heard of any more information about the incident in which she didn't. Tina then showed us where the old DVR system for the cameras used to be, physically showing us that the system was inoperable.

Next, I met with Katy [REDACTED] at her place of employment located at [REDACTED]. I first had her read the Consent to Search form. After agreeing to the consent and signing the form, I placed on a new pair of latex gloves and collected buccal swabs from her.

Last, I met with Evan Fisher at the MHU Office. I first had him read the Consent to Search form. After agreeing to the consent and signing the form, I placed on a new pair of latex gloves and collected buccal swabs from her.

**SYNOPSIS:**

On Sunday June 16, 2019 at approximately 0333 South Bend Police responded to a call of a suspicious person breaking windows in the parking lot of Central High Apartments. Sgt. Ryan O'Neill was the first officer to arrive. While searching the parking lot O'Neill came across a suspect inside the driver side of a black Honda Civic. O'Neill questioned the suspect and the suspect went toward O'Neill with a raised knife. O'Neill ordered the man to stop and drop the knife and when the suspect refused O'Neill fired twice at him. The suspect was then transported to Memorial Hospital by a SBPD officer. MHU was called out.

June 16, 2019 (Sunday)

On Sunday June 16, 2019 at approximately 0409 I was called in for an officer-involved-shooting investigation. On my way to the office I was called by Commander Mike Grzegorek. He gave me a summary of what he knew at that point. He said SBPD received a call of a suspicious person breaking windows in the parking lot of Central High Apartments. He said O'Neill was the first officer to arrive and found a suspicious person going through a car. He said O'Neill confronted him and the man went toward O'Neill with a knife. O'Neill then shoots twice. He said the man was transported to the hospital and was still alive. Commander Grzegorek requested that my partner and I get to the scene ASAP due to the possible loss of evidence to the rain.

I arrived at the office and met with my partner Cpl. Kyle Slater (SJCPD). We made sure we had the needed equipment and supplies on the truck and then left the office at approximately 0454. I drove the MHU truck to the scene and parked it on William St. across from the parking lot entrance. The parking lot and surrounding area had barricades and crime scene tape up preventing entry. There were several SBPD officers providing scene security on William and Colfax Streets. Shortly after we arrived the rain stopped. We were met at the scene by Cpl. Scott Parker (MPD) who is part of the shadow tech program that provides crime scene techs to assist MHU.

I began to document the scene by taking photographs. I took initial photographs from the roof of the MHU truck to get an overall view of the scene and surrounding area. I took photographs of the parking lot which included the black Honda Civic (██████ Indiana license plate) where the suspect was originally found. I continued taking photographs from my vantage point on the truck of the parking lot and surrounding area and continued clockwise with my photographs.

I then began taking ground level photographs of the parking lot from near the William St. entrance of the lot. As I was taking photographs I methodically began moving closer to the black Honda Civic and police cars. As I got closer I took photographs that included evidence markers 1-4 that were marking items of evidence (the markers were placed by SBPD officers prior to our arrival). Evidence markers 1 and 2 marked spent cartridge casings. Item 1 was located near the passenger side rear of SBPD car #3020 (The vehicle that was parked to the rear of the black Honda Civic. The vehicle that Sgt. O'Neill was driving prior to the shooting). Item 2 was located on the passenger side toward the back bumper of SBPD car #3020. Evidence marker 3 marked a knife. Item 3 was located near the passenger side rear tire. Evidence marker 4 marked a tan purse. Item 4 was located in front of and near the driver side front (approximate 45 degree angle from the front driver side bumper) of SBPD car #3020.

We began using our MHU evidence markers to mark items 5 and up. I continued photographing each item before the evidence marker was placed next to it and after the evidence marker was placed next to it.

Evidence marker 5 marked a white tissue type material. This item was located behind the black Honda Civic. Sgt. O'Neill said that the suspect he confronted had a white tissue type material object covering one of his hands when he emerged from the black Honda Civic.

Evidence marker 6 marked a cellphone with cords. Item 6 was located behind a white Subaru SUV (██████████ Alaska license plate) that was parked next to the driver side of the black Honda Civic.

Evidence marker 7 marked a purple purse with coins, lighter, keys that were located behind a white Subaru SUV that was parked next to the driver side of the black Honda Civic.

Evidence marker 8 marked a red stain that was located on the back of the white Subaru SUV.

I continued documenting the scene with overall photographs. I documented two cameras that were on two separate corners of the apartment building near where the shooting took place. We later received information from apartment management that the cameras have been inoperable for some time.

I then documented a dark colored Scion (██████████ Indiana license plate) that was parked on William street. In front of the apartment building. The car had what appeared to be a plastic bag taped around the driver side window opening where the window had been broken out. I later learned that the owner of the vehicle covered the broken window with plastic and reported the damage to police.

I also documented a blue Grand Marquis that was parked on William Street south of the Scion and across the street. The owner of the vehicle reported the theft of the car stereo face plate. The face plate and trim pieces were found on the sidewalk and in the street just north of the vehicle on William Street. Evidence marker 9 marked the stereo faceplate and trim pieces in the street which was across from the entrance into the Central High Apartments parking lot. Evidence marker 10 marked a piece of trim from the stereo faceplate and was located on the sidewalk next to the Grand Marquis.

I continued documenting the parking lot including a white Toyota Highlander (██████████) that had the passenger side window broken out.

We then documented a small round defect (D-1) in the lower portion of the driver side door of the black Honda Civic. We placed a 2 inch scale along the top of the defect and photographed it. We did the same for the other side of the defect (D-2). Based on the characteristics of both defects we determined that D-1 was an entry and D-2 was an exit. We placed a trajectory rod through the defects to get an approximation where the bullet projectile may have ended. The rod pointed to the area underneath the front passenger side tire of the white Subaru that was parked next to the black Honda Civic. We then located bullet projectile fragments underneath the white Subaru in that area near the front passenger side tire. We marked the bullet projectile fragments with evidence markers 11 and 12.

After documenting items of evidence we placed a tape measure to determine certain distances in the scene. We placed the front end of the tape measure on the ground approximately in the middle of the crease of the open driver side door of the black Honda civic. We then placed the other end of the tape measure at the back side of the passenger side rear tire of the police car that was behind the black Honda Civic. The distance was approximately 23'. The distance to the knife from the front end of the tape measure was approximately 21'. The distance from the front of the tape measure to the rear bumper of the black Honda Civic was approximately 7 1/2'.

After documenting the scene with photographs we collected items of evidence and placed them on the MHU truck. We then drove back to the MHU office where we placed the evidence in locked and alarmed storage. We downloaded the photographs and video to the MHU server.

**June 17, 2019 (Monday)**

On Monday June 17<sup>th</sup> I attended the autopsy of Eric Logan. It was performed at St. Joseph Hospital in Fort Wayne by Dr. Darin Wolfe who was assisted by Bethany Wagner. The autopsy began at approximately 1000 and I documented the autopsy with photographs. Dr. Wolfe was able to locate and remove a bullet projectile that was in deep tissue near the spine. I collected the projectile along with the following items from the autopsy: head hair, DNA bloodstain card, CD of x-rays, body bag tag #1789280, and fingerprint cards. I was unable to recover fingernail clippings due to Logan's fingernails being well beneath the tips of his fingers. Dr. Wolfe gave me a preliminary report stating the cause of death as a gunshot wound of abdomen and manner of death as homicide. I transported all items to MHU and placed them in locked and alarmed storage.

On Monday June 20<sup>th</sup> I took items 3-5, 7-10, 16, 19, 21, 27-29, 31 to the ISP lab in Lowell for examination.

On 06/16/2019 at approximately 4:00 AM I received a call from SBPD dispatch informing me there had been an officer involved shooting in the parking lot of Central High Apartments and the CMHU was being called out to investigate. Evidently, the officer had confronted an individual as he was in the process of taking items out of a vehicle he had just broke into. The suspect came at the officer with a knife then was shot by the officer. After being shot, the suspect threw the knife at the officer, striking him in the forearm. I informed the dispatch operator I would be on my way to the office.


Before leaving my residence I phoned Commander Mike Grzegorek to see where he wanted me to go. Since there were things to be done at the office, he asked me to come there.

Once I arrived at the office I spoke with Commander Grzegorek and Prosecutor Ken Cotter as to what they needed me to get done. Cotter informed me we needed to locate the victim's of the four vehicle larceny's, get the radio traffic recordings from dispatch, find out what type of call O'Neil was on and who called it in, and identify the individual shot by O'Neil.

I first contacted dispatch and spoke with Savanna Fettig, the dispatcher who took the initial call. Fettig told me the caller, who asked to remain anonymous, called to report a suspicious person with a flashlight after hearing a loud crash in the parking lot of Central High Apartments. The caller described the person as having on a black raincoat and dark clothing. Fettig then dispatched this information out to officers. Fettig gave me the phone number of the caller who asked to remain anonymous which was [REDACTED]

After getting the information about the call and caller I asked Fettig if they were getting the radio traffic downloaded yet for our case. She informed me Gary Clem, who is the only person able to download the files, was off work and nobody had called him. I asked Fettig to have her supervisor call Clem then to have Clem call me.

A short time later I received a phone call from Gary Clem and informed him of the situation. Clem said it was no problem for him to come in and get me the files I needed. Clem said if possible that he would email them to me on my city email. If not, I would have to come pick them up.

While all this was going on I was reminded by Cotter we would also need to get the Shot Spotter information for this case as well.

I next started looking into the owners of the vehicle that had been broken into throughout the area where the incident took place. The first vehicle information I was given was from the vehicle Logan was caught rummaging through as O'Neil approached him. The vehicle information is as follows:

During the time I was collecting the vehicle information I was informed there was some possible evidence located on Logan when the incident occurred. I was told by evidence technicians they had located a white iPhone charger, a cell phone charger for a cigarette lighter, a purse and a plastic GPS/cell phone mount around the scene. I was asked that when I speak with the victim's, I asked them what all was missing from their vehicles so the items could be returned to their owners.

While still out at the scene I spoke with the owner of the Toyota Highlander, Katy [REDACTED] [REDACTED] informed me she was missing her purse, which she described to me, but was unsure if anything else was missing. Since I knew the suspect had a purse on his person when he was shot, I asked [REDACTED] to give me a minute so I could check to see if we had it.

I immediately went to speak with Inv. Karl Karch about the purse. We went to the CMHU evidence truck and looked inside of the purse for identification. Inside of a wallet inside of the purse was an Indiana driver's license in the name of Katy [REDACTED] as well as numerous other credit cards and such. I told Inv. Karch I would tell the victim we had her stuff so she did not have to cancel anything.

After looking at the purse I told [REDACTED] we did in fact have her missing items in our custody. I also explained we would not be able to release those items at this time due to them needing to be processed by our evidence team. [REDACTED] said she understood and asked that I call when she could obtain the items.

Since we had still not made identification of the deceased I decided to drive to the hospital to see if they had possibly been told who he was. While there I spoke with Plt. Aaron Brick, who was watching over the individual since he had got out of surgery. Plt. Brick advised me they had still not received any information on who the individual might be but Plt. Brick believed he had dealt with him before and thought he was homeless. I decided to take a photo and drive around to the different homeless shelters and hangout's to see if any of them might be able to identify the individual.

After driving to numerous places and showing the photo to several people I still was unable to make any identification. Taking a chance the individual might have

possibly been arrested in the past or at one point in time was fingerprinted for some reason or another; I decided to do a check. I soon learned the individuals name was Eric Jack Logan, dob: 12/16/1965, [REDACTED] I also obtained a photo of Logan attached with his particulars and immediately recognized our unknown person as being Eric Logan.

While at the hospital getting Logan's fingerprints I was given a closed plastic bag by Pfc. Brick said to contain some of Logan's cloths. Pfc. Brick asked if I could transport the cloths to the MHU office for our evidence technicians.

I immediately informed the other investigators who our unknown person was going to be then headed back to the office to see if I could find anything in our South Bend database in reference to family members in our area.

Soon after looking through the South Bend system I located incident reports listing Eric Logan as a suspect in numerous different cases. The reports listed a [REDACTED] as the victim/girlfriend in these cases. I was able to find a cell phone number, [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] from an April 15<sup>th</sup> 2019 report and decided to call it.

The person identifying herself as [REDACTED] on the other end of the phone was uncooperative and demanded I tell her why I was asking about Eric Logan. I explained I would not speak with her over the phone about this and asked for a relative's name or phone number of Logan's. Anderson eventually gave me an address of [REDACTED], which is where Logan's sister, [REDACTED] currently lived.

Sgt. Brian Cook and I immediately drove to the [REDACTED] address and found [REDACTED] already at the residence speaking with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was screaming at the top of her lungs making it unable for us to speak with [REDACTED]. I was eventually able to speak with [REDACTED] and ask if her brother was in fact Eric Jack Logan. [REDACTED] said it was her brother so I showed her the picture I had taken in the hospital and asked if this was her brother. [REDACTED] said it was her brother and asked what happened to him. Before telling her what happened I asked if Logan's mother or father was still alive and in the area. [REDACTED] said their mother lives at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and called her to make sure she was home. It was at this time I

explained to ██████ that her brother was deceased. I answered a few quick questions for ██████ then left to go speak with Logan's mother.

Sgt. Cook and I arrived at the West Washington street address a short time later and spoke with Logan's mother, ██████. I explained to ██████ that her son was deceased and briefly described the circumstances surrounding his death. Sgt. Cook and I agreed to stay with ██████ until someone came over to be with her due to the horrible news we had just given her. A short time later a male friend of ██████ arrived at her residence so we left. Before leaving I gave ██████ my business card and asked her to call if she needed anything from us. I also invited her to come to our office in a couple days if she wished to hear in more detail what exactly happened the night Logan was shot. Newbill thanked us as we left her residence.

From ██████'s apartment I could see two of the vehicle's Logan had broken into and noticed her neighbor was one of the victim's of the vehicle larcenies. The crime scene was only a short distance away from where Logan was living with his mother.

June 17<sup>th</sup> 2019

Shortly after arriving to work the following morning I was informed one of the vehicle larceny victim's, Evan ██████, had called SBPD uniform to add additional items missing from his vehicle. ██████ had told the officer he noticed at least one if not two of his knives were missing from his vehicle and had been stolen on 06/16/2019.

After a short meeting involving the case I spoke with Commander Grzegorek and Prosecutor Ken Cotter about Evan ██████ adding two knives stolen from his vehicle as well as him being able to identify each knife. Cotter and Grzegorek agreed we needed to get ██████ in for an interview as soon as possible since the knife Logan had might have been taken from ██████'s vehicle.

I immediately found the contact information for Evan ██████ and phoned him to see if he could come in for an interview and look at a knife to see if it was one taken from his vehicle. ██████ said he was at work but understood the importance of the interview and would check with his employer to see if he could come down. A short

time later I received a call back from [REDACTED] saying he was given the okay to come down whenever. [REDACTED] agreed to come in right away.

After speaking with [REDACTED] I met with Inv. Kyle Slater to see if he could get a photo of the knife found at the scene or the knife itself to show [REDACTED] during the interview so he could either identify it or not. Inv. Slater said he would show the actual knife to [REDACTED] while it was inside of the evidence box. Since this was a very important piece of evidence in the case, we both agreed Fisher would not be allowed to touch the knife at any point.

At approximately 12:30 PM Evan [REDACTED] arrived at the CMHU office. I escorted [REDACTED] to the west interview room and explained this would be a video recorded interview and I would need to step out to get the video recording started. The following is a synopsis of the interview with [REDACTED]. For complete details of the interview refer to the recording. The interview was subsequently turned in as evidence in this case.

Evan Fisher

I began the interview by explaining to [REDACTED] he could not touch the knife and would only be able to look at it. [REDACTED] understood and Inv. Slater came over to show him the knife. Again [REDACTED] said he believed two knives were taken from his vehicle but definitely a Gerber knife was taken. [REDACTED] added that the knife was in a sheath when it was inside of his vehicle when it was taken. [REDACTED] said they looked around where his vehicle was broken into but was unable to locate the knife or sheath.

Using gloves and not letting [REDACTED] hold the evidence box the knife was shown to [REDACTED]. After looking at the knife [REDACTED] immediately said "Yep, that's mine". Since when we recovered the knife the tip was broken I asked Fisher if it was broken before it was stolen. [REDACTED] said it was not broken when it was taken. I asked if there were any markings or anything to make [REDACTED] 100% positive it was his. [REDACTED] said there was nothing like that however he was very sure it was his knife.

[REDACTED] said it was not forced entry into his girlfriends' vehicle where the knife was because she had left the door unlocked. The knife was located in the driver's side door. There was also a spare key in the center console that had been removed and put in

the ignition, which was then placed in the ON position by whoever broke into the vehicle. Believing the suspect had tried to steal the vehicle however the key fob had broken off and did not allow the car to be started.

Since there was nothing more to add, I ended the interview with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] left the office a short time later.

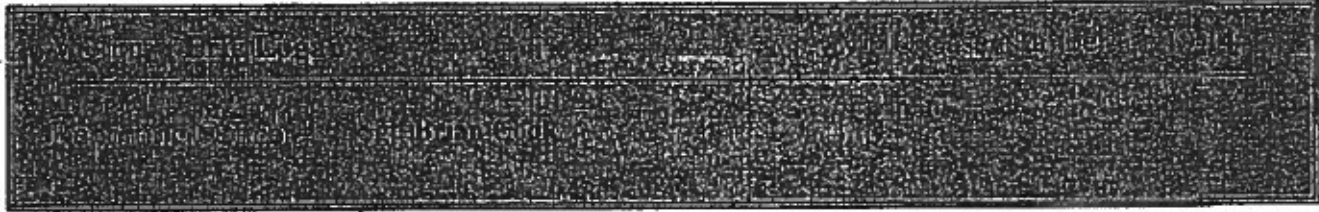

### Synopsis

On June 16, 2019 at 0324 hours South Bend Police were dispatch to the Central High Apartments, locate at 110 N. William Street, reference a theft in progress. Dispatch advised that there was a male party busting out vehicle windows and going through cars. Sgt. Ryan O'Neill was the first Officer to arrive. Sgt. O'Neill observed a vehicle's driver's door standing open and saw a male parties butt sticking up in the air in/near the open driver's door. Sgt. O'Neill parked his Police Vehicle at an angle behind the vehicle and exited his Police Vehicle. Sgt. O'Neill illuminated the driver's door with his flashlight and asked the male party if that was his vehicle. The male party exited the vehicle and advised O'Neill that it was his vehicle. Sgt. O'Neill then observed the male party had a woman's purse sticking out of the male party's jacket and that the male party appeared to be bleeding from his hand. Sgt. O'Neill then asked the man why he had a woman's purse. The male then raised his hand over his head and O'Neill observed a knife in the male's raised hand. Sgt. O'Neill then drew his weapon and started backing away from the male while giving him verbal commands to drop the knife. The male party then started moving aggressively towards Sgt. O'Neill, knife still raised, and Sgt. O'Neill fired his weapon two times striking the male party. The male party then threw the knife at Sgt. O'Neill hitting O'Neill in his left arm. The male party stayed on his feet but stopped progressing towards O'Neill. Sgt. O'Neill immediately radioed shots fired and send Medics.

Several Officers started arriving and were able to secure the suspect in handcuffs. Officers then checked the suspect for injuries. Locating at least ine gunshot wound to the man's torso and Medics still not at the scene the decision was made to "load and go" putting the suspect into a Police car and rushing him to the Emergency Room as it would be quicker.

Once at Memorial Hospital the suspect, still not identified, was rushed into surgery for his wounds. The unknown male underwent several hours of surgery and was moved to ICU but ultimately died from his injuries. It was not until several hours later that the unknown male was finally identified as Eric Logan. Next of kin was then immediately notified.

### Narrative

On June 16, 2019 at approximately 0400 hours I was contacted by communications and advised that MHU was being activated reference an Officer involved shooting. I was then

advised to head to MHU. I arrived at MHU at approximately 0430 hours and started gathering the preliminary information and conducting interviews.

**June 16, 2019 at 0516 hours**

**Interview with:** Aaron Knepper (SBPD)

On June 16, 2019 at approximately 0516 hours I interviewed Aaron Knepper at MHU. Commander Mike Grzegorek was present as well. Knepper is the Officer that assisted at the scene and transported Eric Logan to Memorial Hospital. Here is a synopsis of the information that Knepper provided.

Officer Knepper advised that he heard dispatch send units to the Central High Apartments reference a person breaking into cars. Knepper advised that he heard Sgt. O'Neal arrive at the scene. Knepper states that a short time later Sgt. O'Neill advised that shots had been fired and that he needed Medics. Knepper advised that at that time he ran lights and sirens to the scene. Knepper advised that upon his arrival he observed other Officer's securing a male subject in handcuffs. Once the subject was secure Knepper assisted in checking the suspect's injuries. The male appeared to be suffering from at least one gunshot wound to his abdomen area. Knepper advised that with Medics still not on scene he asked Sgt. O'Neill if a "load and go" would be better than waiting for an ambo. Sgt. O'Neill advised Officer's to get Logan to the hospital quickly. The male party was placed into the backseat of Knepper's police Vehicle and taken to Memorial's Emergency Room. Knepper ran lights and sirens to the hospital while other South Bend Officers blocked intersections for a quick safe arrival. Officers were met at the emergency entrance by medical personnel who attended to the male party.

On June 16, 2019 at approximately 0537 hours I interviewed Matthew Winter at MHU. Commander Mike Grzegorek was present as well. Officer Winter was one of the Officer's that arrived at Memorial Hospital and assisted. Here is a synopsis of the information that Winter provided.

Officer Winter advised that he overheard radio traffic that Sgt. O'Neal had called out shots fired and Medics needed. While in-route to the shots fired call he heard Officer Knepper say he was going to "load and go" and take the patient to the hospital himself since Medics had not arrived. Winter advised that he diverted and went to Memorial Hospital. Winter advised that he assisted other Officer's in unloading the patient. Winter advised that he then collected the clothes that medical personnel had removed from the male party. Winters then transported the clothes to MHU where they were turned over to MHU personnel.

This interview was recorded both audio/visual on DVD. The above synopsis is a brief generalization of the interview and not intended as verbatim. For full details see recorded interview.

**June 16, 2019 at 0555 hours**

**Interview with: Ryan Hiipakka (SBPD)**

On June 16, 2019 at approximately 0555 hours I interviewed Ryan Hiipakka at MHU. Commander Mike Grzegorek was present as well. Hiipakka was one of the road supervisors working when the incident occurred. Here is a synopsis of the information that Ryan Hiipakka provided.

Hiipakka states that he was on a domestic call and never heard the original dispatch. He states that he did hear Sgt. O'Neal come over the radio and say shots fired send me Medics. Hiipakka states that a few seconds later, he (Hiipakka) got on the radio and asked O'Neal if he was signal 4 (Okay). Hiipakka advised that O'Neal responded that he was okay and something about a knife. Hiipakka advised that he was finishing the call that he was on so he ran lights and sirens to the shooting scene. Hiipakka advised that when he arrived there were already several Officers there and they were putting up crime scene tape.



Hiipaka advised that he immediately checked on O'Neal to make sure he was okay. Hiipaka states that O'Neal told him that he found a guy inside a car and tried talking to the guy. The guy exited the car with a knife raised and started towards O'Neal. O'Neal stated that he drew his weapon and ordered the guy to drop the knife. The guy did not comply and continued coming toward him (O'Neal). O'Neal advised that he then fired two times at the suspect who then threw the knife at him (O'Neal) hitting him in the left forearm. Hiipakka advised that O'Neal had a red divot mark on his left forearm where he had been hit by the thrown knife. Hiipakka advised that he observed a knife laying on the ground near O'Neal's police vehicle, along with two spent shell casings.

Hiipakka advised that he then contacted the shift Captain, Joe Galea, and advised him of the Officer involved shooting. Hiipakka advised that Galea then brought him a replacement gun for O'Neal so his (O'Neal's) issued gun and magazines could be temporarily seized per protocol. Hiipaka advised that he took O'Neal's issued gun and magazines and replaced them with the gun that Captain Galea had given him. Hiipakka advised that he took O'Neal's gun and made it safe by removing the magazine and ejecting the live round from the chamber. Hiipakka advised that Officers carry three (3) magazines and their administrative load is seventeen (17) bullets per magazine and a chambered round in the gun totaling eighteen rounds initially for a total of fifty two rounds (52). Hiipakka advised that he transported O'Neal's gun and magazines to MHU per protocol.

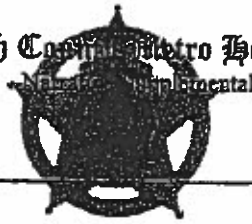

On June 16, 2019 at approximately 0706 hours I interviewed Sgt. Ryan O'Neal at MHU. Commander Mike Grzegorek was present as well. Here is a synopsis of the information that O'Neal provided.

O'Neill advised that he was responding to the Central High Apartments reference a male/black with a flashlight breaking car windows and going through vehicles. O'Neill advised that he entered the parking lot of the apartments and turned his alley lights on that are on his light bar to illuminate the area. O'Neill was driving down the rows of parked cars in the parking lot and saw a dark colored Honda car with the driver's door standing open. From the open car door O'Neill advised that he could see a pair of legs and a buttocks sticking out of the open car door. O'Neill advised that he then parked at an angle behind the vehicle with the open door and exited him Police vehicle. O'Neill advised that he was not sure if the person in the car was the owner of the car and leaving for work or possibly arriving home. O'Neill advised that he approached the vehicle with his flashlight in his left hand. O'Neill advised that he was near the back of the car with the open door and he announced himself to the person inside. O'Neill asked the person inside the vehicle if they were the owner of the car. O'Neal states that the male advised him that the vehicle was his. O'Neill advised that the male party started exiting the vehicle. O'Neill was watching the male party and saw that he had a woman's purse sticking out of his coat. O'Neill asked the man why he had a woman's purse and then noticed the man also had a large hunting style knife in his hand. O'Neal then put the man at gunpoint and ordered the man to drop the knife. The man did not comply and raised the knife and started advancing towards O'Neill. O'Neill being approximately eight to ten feet from the man began to back up to create space between him and the armed suspect. While backing up, O'Neal ordered the man numerous times to stop and drop the knife. O'Neill states that the man did not comply and started grunting and continued towards O'Neill. O'Neill advised that the man was approaching with the knife raised about the same speed that O'Neill was back peddling. O'Neill was getting close to his own Police vehicle and running out of



room to back up and the suspect was still approaching. O'Neill now fearing for his life fired his duty weapon two times at the suspect. O'Neal states that the suspect was close enough that he shot with his weapon near his own chest area, firing two shots. O'Neal advised that after the two gunshots the man stopped approaching and launched the knife at him (O'Neill), hitting O'Neill in the left forearm but remained standing. O'Neal advised that he immediately got on the radio and advised "shots fired send an ambo". I asked O'Neill if the man was still standing why he (O'Neill) only fired his gun two times at the man. O'Neal advised that after he fired and the man threw the knife at him the man then stopped advancing, he (Sgt. O'Neill) no longer felt the man was a threat.

O'Neill states that he then ordered the man to get onto his knees and the man complied. As other Officers were arriving the man stood back up. O'Neill advised that he believed that the man was on his feet when he was secured by other Officers. O'Neill states that with no ambulance on scene he was asked by other Officers if they should "load and go" and get the man to the hospital. O'Neill states that he advised the Officers "yes" do a "load and go" and get him to the hospital ASAP.

O'Neill was also taken to the hospital to be checked out. O'Neill had a raised red spot on his left forearm where he had been struck with the knife. O'Neill's injury was photographed.

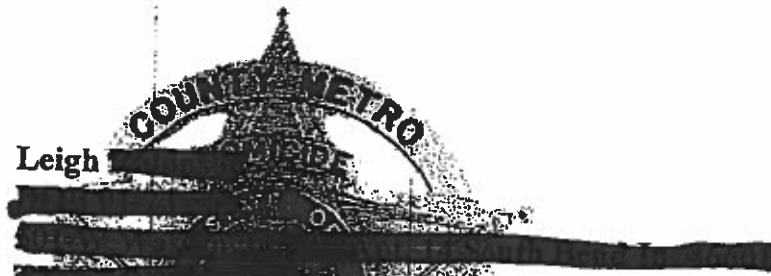

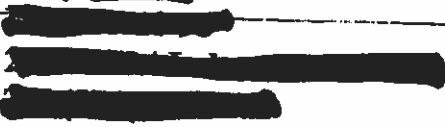

Brady advised that Officers are never taught to meet a deadly force threat with a less lethal approach. Deadly force should always be met with deadly force. Brady explained that if the threat deescalates the Officer can always transition to a less lethal option. Brady advised that an edged weapon is definitely a deadly weapon and should be met with deadly force. He explained the twenty one feet rule. This rule is taught by a company, Force Science, that explains that an Officer can be charged from a person who is twenty one feet away from him/her and not have time to react and pull their weapon to engage. Brady explained that the closer the threat is the more dangerous he/she is. Brady explained that South Bend Police have numerous instructors that teach different skills. However, every instructor teaches and uses the guidelines of the policy that Brady provided to me.

Sunday June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019

On the above date at approximately 05:12 hrs. I was off duty, off call, and at my residence. I received a call from MHU Commander Michael Grzegorek who told me that his team of the St. Joseph County Metro Homicide Unit was activated to investigate an officer involved shooting that had occurred around 03:30 hrs. in the parking lot of The Central High Apartments.

Grzegorek told me that I was being activated to assist in the investigation. Grzegorek told me I was to take custody of the suspect's clothing being brought to MHU from the hospital by a uniform officer. Next, I was to take custody of and document Sgt. O'Neill's duty weapon.

I learned that the deceased, Eric Logan was transported to Memorial Hospital ER. in a marked squad car driven by Pfc. Knepper. There is blood evidence that needed to be photographed from the patrol vehicle. My final task in the investigation was to document Sgt. O'Neill's person with digital photos. Further information was that Sgt. O'Neill sustained an injury to one of his arms from Logan throwing the knife at him.

At 05:45 hrs. I arrive at the MHU office. Once there I meet with Off. Winter who has the clothing items collected from Logan at Memorial Hospital. I opened the white plastic bag and begun hanging the items in the short term drying room. The clothing items had cut marks and red stains on them. Inside the bag amongst the clothing items there was a white USB cell phone charging cord.

Inside the right front pocket of a large black hooded sweat shirt I found a cell phone charging base that plugs into a cigarette lighter port for a vehicle. In that same pocket I found and recovered a black plastic cellphone or GPS mounting plate for a vehicle. I set these items aside and advised Commander Grzegorek. (See MHU property sheets for further).

I met with and collected from Sgt. Hiipakka a blue gun box containing Sgt. O'Neill's issued duty weapon. I opened the weapon box. The weapon was a Smith & Wesson M&P 9mm handgun with serial number HKB6675. The weapon was cleared with the slide back in the locked position. There were three magazines inside the box along with the round that was chambered in the weapon.

This was the condition of the weapon as it was turned over to me by Sgt. Hiipakka. Two (2) of the magazines contained (17) live rounds in each magazine which would make them fully loaded. The third magazine contained (15) live rounds. These magazines along with the live round from the chamber were documented and property receipted. The chambered round bore head stamp FC 9mm +P. I documented the weapon with digital photos.

Next I documented Sgt. O'Neill's person with digital photos. On Sgt. O'Neill's left outer forearm I observed a raised area in the form of a small knot with two abrasion's on the middle of his left outer forearm. O'Neill stated that this is where he was struck by the knife when the suspect threw it at him.

I took several overall digital photos of the O'Neill's left arm. I placed in a grey scale and documented with medium and close up photos.

I proceed out to the MHU garage and begin processing the vehicle used to transport Logan. Parked there is the white Ford Taurus 4 door marked patrol vehicle #711 issued to Pfc. Knepper. Pfc. Knepper is the Officer who drove Logan to Memorial Hospital ER. Logan was placed in the right rear passenger's seat of this vehicle. The vehicle had Indiana Police plate 20638 on the back. I took overall photos of the vehicle.

I opened up the right rear passenger's door of the vehicle. On the inside rear of the door frame I observed areas of red transfer stains. The stains proceed inward from the painted area of the inner rear door frame, across the rubber door weather-stripping, and into the black plastic rear seat area.

I placed in grey scales by the larger stains then labeled them, BS1, BS2, and BS3. I documented the stains with overall, medium, and close up photos. I collected two moistened swabs from each of the stain areas using sterile swabs from unopened packages, changing out sterile latex gloves in between collections. I secured the swabs as evidence. At 07:51 hrs. I completed processing of the vehicle. I placed all of the photos onto the MHU server then placed the swabs into the short term evidence refrigerator.

Nothing further to report at this time.

Sunday June 16, 2019

On the above listed date at approximately 3:40am I was contacted by the St. Joseph County PSAP Center and advised that there had been an officer involved shooting involving a South Bend Police Officer. The dispatcher advised that SBPD Sgt. Hiipakka was on scene and wanted me to call him. Per protocol all police involved shootings in St. Joseph County are investigated by the Metro Homicide Unit. I made contact with Sgt. Hiipakka by phone and he advised me that Sgt. Ryan O'Neill was the officer who was involved in the shooting. He explained that Sgt. O'Neill was the first responding officer to a call of a person possibly breaking into vehicles at Central High Apartments on William St. in South Bend. Sgt. Hiipakka said that Sgt. O'Neill encountered the suspect of the thefts inside a vehicle, that the suspect came at Sgt. O'Neill with a knife and that Sgt. O'Neill had fired two (2) shots at the suspect. He said that at least one of the rounds fired hit the suspect. He went on to tell me that the suspect was at the hospital and he believed that he was taken to surgery. He also informed me that during the encounter with the suspect (who at that time still had not been identified), the suspect threw the knife at Sgt. O'Neill striking Sgt. O'Neill in the left forearm. He explained that it was a minor injury but they were taking Sgt. O'Neill to the hospital to be checked out. It was raining at the time I was driving in, when I was talking to Sgt. Hiipakka, and I asked him if he had evidence technicians at the scene. I asked him to have his technicians start taking photographs of the scene to document any evidence that could be fleeting due to the rain. He assured me that he would make sure that that was done.



After talking with Sgt. Hiipakka, I notified Prosecutor Ken Cotter and Deputy Prosecutor Chris Fronk of the call out and the details of what I had been told to that point. I also activated the on-call MHU Investigators and Technicians.

I first went to Memorial Hospital as the suspect and Sgt. O'Neill had both been transported and were being treated for their injuries there. Upon my arrival I was directed to the exam room where Sgt. O'Neill was located. In the room with Sgt. O'Neill was Sgt. Hiipakka and Captain Joe Galea. Captain Galea had brought Sgt. Hiipakka a new handgun and magazines to trade out for Sgt. O'Neill's, which were going to be taken for the investigation. I was present when Sgt. Hiipakka took Sgt. O'Neill's service weapon and magazines, and gave him the replacement weapon and magazines. I asked Sgt. O'Neill if he would be willing to come to the MHU after he was released to give a statement. Sgt. O'Neill stated that he did not have any problem giving his statement once he was released and said that there was nothing complicated about the incident. Although I was not there to ask Sgt. O'Neill any question about the shooting, he voluntarily started telling me of the call and the shooting, and I let him talk. He told me that as he pulled into the north side drive of the Central High Apartments he turned on his alley lights on his light bar and slowly started to check between the cars of the first row as he drove in. He said when he got to the end of the first row, and as he was about to make the turn to go on to the next row, he saw the driver's door of a black Honda open and someone leaning inside it. He said all that he could see of the person was a buttocks and legs. He said he stopped his car near the back of the Honda and got out of his car with his flashlight in his left hand. He said he did not get out his tazer because he was not sure if he was approaching the suspect that had been called in or a resident that may be coming home from a bar, as the time was shortly after the bars had let out. He said he did not want to scare the person if it was a resident but wanted to



be close enough in case it was the suspect. He said that it was his experience in these types of calls that the suspect more often than not tries to run. He said he walked around the front of his squad car and when he got to the back bumper of the Honda the person was in, he announced himself and asked the person if that was their car. He said the person responded "yes" and he could tell it was a male voice. He said he noticed at that time that the person had a woman's purse tucked into the front of his sweatshirt. He said he then said to the man, "if this is your car why do you have a woman's purse". He said the man then began to back out of the vehicle. As the man backed out of the vehicle he said he was watching his hands. Sgt. O'Neill said when he first saw the man's right hand he saw a white napkin or paper towel around it with what appeared to have blood on it. At this point he said he felt that that this was probably the suspect of thefts, as he thought he had probably cut himself breaking a window to a vehicle as had been reported in the call. He said as the suspect exited the vehicle he continued to watch his hand and as he did he saw the blade of fairly large knife protruding from the suspect's right hand. He said he immediately drew his handgun and ordered the suspect to drop the knife. He said the suspect turned towards him and raised the knife above his head. Sgt. O'Neill said he starting backing up and the suspect began moving towards him. He said he continued to order the suspect to drop the knife. Sgt. O'Neill said he took three or four steps backwards and said he knew that he was "running out of real estate" as his car was directly behind him. He said the suspect got within seven to eight feet of him and he fired two shots. When Sgt. O'Neill told me this he was demonstrating with his hands and had his right hand up near and close to his chest. He said when he shot at the suspect, the suspect threw the knife at him. He said the knife hit him in his left forearm, which he demonstrated was up in front of his chest with his flashlight in his left hand, and then fell to the ground. He showed me his left

forearm and I could see small red mark and what appeared to be a slight swelling. Sgt. O'Neill said the suspect stopped after he fired the shots but stayed up on his feet and did not go down. He said at that point he was not sure if he hit the suspect or not. He said he kept the suspect at gunpoint and called in that shots were fired and he needed an ambo at his location. He said the suspect did not say anything and only made groaning and grunting noises, which is what he was doing as he was coming towards him with the knife. He said the first arriving officers arrived fairly quickly and he told them to get the man into cuffs. He said one of the first arriving officers pulled up the suspect's sweatshirt and found that he had been hit in the right upper abdomen. He said one of the officers asked him if they should put the suspect in a squad car and take him to the hospital. Sgt. O'Neill said he told the officers to do so as there was not ambo on scene as of that time. I told Sgt. O'Neill, Sgt. Hiipakka and Capt. Galea that I was going to check on the status of the suspect and would then be going to the MHU office. Sgt. Hiipakka advised me that he would make sure that Sgt. O'Neill was transported there once he was release from the hospital.


The ER Doctor did not have any update of the suspects' condition and only affirmed that he was in surgery.

After leaving Memorial Hospital I went to the MHU office where I assisted Sgt. Brian Cook (the lead investigator in this case) with the interviews of the initial responding officers and later Sgt. Ryan O'Neill. Please see Sgt. Cook's report and the digital recordings for details of those interviews.



Evidence Technician Kyle Slater recorded a video of that walk through. I should note that the technicians had a tape measure already laid out on the ground stretching from the open door of the black Honda to the back tire of Sgt. O'Neill's squad car. This proved helpful in getting approximate distances of where the suspect was located in relation to where Sgt. O'Neill was during their encounter, according to Sgt. O'Neill's statement. For complete details of that walk through please see the video.

I should note that Sgt. Cook's partner, Inv. Chris Kronewitter, was also called in but was not allowed to be part of the interviews or the actual investigation of the shooting, as he is a South Bend Police Officer and MHU protocol is to keep investigators within the unit from the involved agency out of the investigation. I did however utilize him in trying to determine how many vehicles were broken into and who owned them. He was also tasked with trying to locate those owners and to determine what, if anything, may have been taken from their vehicles. Inv. Kronewitter also later assisted with trying to determine the identity of the suspect.

Once we completed the interviews we began trying to determine the identity of the suspect. Ultimately Sgt. Cook and Investigator Kronewitter were able to determine the suspects' identity though his fingerprints. The suspect was found to be Eric Levonne Logan, DOB: 12-26-1965, [REDACTED]

We were later notified that Mr. Logan had made it through surgery and was placed in the Intensive Care Unit at Memorial Hospital. Shortly after receiving this information we were notified that Mr. Logan had died as a result of his injuries. Sgt. Cook and Inv. Kronewitter were able to locate a sister of Mr. Logans', and later his mother. Notification was made to both of them.


Tuesday June 18, 2019

On the above listed date Prosecutor Ken Cotter advised me that he had received a 2 page 2008 report from his Chief Investigator David Newton. Pros. Cotter explained that the report was a SBPD Advisory Report that Newton had written in 2008 (when he was a Lieutenant with the SBPD) and forwarded on to SBPD Administration. He went on to tell me that the report was in relation to allegations made against Sgt. Ryan O'Neill, by other officers, of making racially inappropriate remarks. Pros. Cotter did email me the report, which has been printed and is being placed into evidence as part of this case. I should note that this is not the first that I had heard of this report. When I called to brief SBPD Chief Scott Ruskowski after the suspect had died from his injuries on the morning of the shooting, Chief Ruskowski told me that a female citizen had posted the same report on Facebook the morning of the shooting before Sgt. O'Neill's name or any details of the shooting were released.

Thursday June 20, 2019

On the above listed date I contacted Prosecutor Ken Cotter about obtaining a Prosecutor's Subpoena for the Internal Investigation file for the 2008 report made by David Newton. I had spoken to Chief Ruskowski and he informed me that an internal investigation had been done on the matter. Prosecutor Cotter was able to secure a Prosecutor's Subpoena for the file. The subpoena was signed by the Honorable Judge Elizabeth Hurley. That subpoena was later served by MHU evidence Technician Kyle Slater. The internal investigation file was turned over to Slater, who brought it back to the MHU office to be submitted as evidence to this case.


I did inspect the file and found that the internal investigation was assigned to Lt. John Collins on 07-23-2008. The nature of the investigation was titled Conduct Unbecoming a Police Officer. The investigation covered three separate individuals on three separate occasions. The individuals that were involved in the complaints against Sgt. O'Neill (Cpl. O'Neill at the time) were Cpl. Joy Glanz PN#2051, Ptlm. Hibbs PN# 2152 and Ptlm. Elwaer PN# 2161.

The situation involving Cpl. Glanz was in reference to a traffic stop after a pursuit on 01-25-2008, in which Cpl. Glanz accuses O'Neill of making inappropriate racial comments to a female white who was involved in the stop. Sgt. Ryan O'Neill and Officer Joy Glanz both took polygraph examinations in reference to that event. The polygraphs were administered by Cynthia Guest of the St. Joseph County Police Department. According to the reports filed by Guest, O'Neill showed no deception and therefore passed his polygraph while Officer Glanz did show deception and therefore failed hers.

I saw no report that indicated Ptlm. Hibb was interviewed about the accusations against O'Neill that Lt. Newton attributes to him. It is unknown if he failed to cooperate with the internal investigation or was not contacted.

The situation with Ptlm. Elwaer was reported by Lt. Newton to be in reference to conversations that Ptlm. Elwaer and O'Neill had (during the FTO process) about Muslim and Islamic people where O'Neill's comments were derogatory and made Elwaer feel "uncomfortable". A letter in the investigation file from Lt. Collins to Chief Jeff Walters on 10-14-2008 talks about this situation. Lt. Collins relays to Chief Walters that he spoke to Ptlm. Elwaer and that it was apparent to him that Ptlm Elwaer thought highly of O'Neill and his abilities as a trainer. Lt. Collins relayed that Ptlm. Elwaer had expressed that he felt uncomfortable with some of the topics they discussed in terms of Islamics and Muslims but did not compel to


