**Narrative**

On 6/16/19 at 4:10am, I was contacted by the St. Joseph County Communication Center for a Metro Homicide Unit callout. I am a shadow tech for MHU and was on call. I responded to the Central High Apartments at 110 N Williams St. South Bend IN. I arrived on scene and met with Inv. Slater (MHU) and Inv. Karch (MHU). I observed two SBPD squad cars in the Northwest parking lot of Central High Apartments. Two spent casings were located on the ground next to the first SBPD vehicle. I also observed a knife near the patrol car. Scattered on the ground was loose change, a cell phone with charging cords, purse, wallet, keys, and a white tissue. Near where the majority of property was located was a Black Honda Civic with IN plate VTK152 with the driver's door open. The Honda Civic was parked next to a white SUV with Alaska plates. The liftgate on the SUV had a red stain that was smeared. After conducting a walk through, I retrieved the video recorder and assisted in documenting the scene. I video taped the scene as Inv. Karch took photographs.

After the scene was documented with photographs and video, I assisted in locating, marking, and documenting evidence. A bullet strike was located on the open driver's door of the black Honda Civic. We also located bullet fragments under the white SUV's front passenger tire area. The items of evidence was then re-photographed. I then assisted Inv. Slater with collecting the evidence. All evidence collected was retained by MHU for case 19-14.

A secondary walkthrough was conducted and the scene was released. I then returned to service.

**RESULTS/OPINIONS/INTERPRETATIONS:**

**Item 001** **Knife:** No blood was detected by presumptive chemical testing. Two samples, one from the handle (item 001A1) and one from the blade (item 001A2), were retained as item 001A.

Item 001A Two samples (items 001A1 and 001A2) failed to demonstrate a

sufficient quantity of DNA for further analysis.

**Item 002**

**Purse and contents:** Six samples of the purse (Items 002A1 through 002A6) were retained as item 002A. No examination of the contents was performed at this time.

## Item 002A

Six samples (items 002A1 through 002A6) failed to demonstrate a sufficient quantity of DNA for further analysis.

**Item 003**

**Tissue:** No blood was detected by presumptive chemical testing.

**Item 004**

**Wallet and contents:** One sample was retained as item 004A. No examination of the contents was performed at this time.

## Item 004A

The DNA profile obtained demonstrated the presence of a mixture in which the number of contributors cannot reasonably be assumed. Therefore, no further conclusions were drawn.

**Item 005**

**Swabs of Subaru:** Four swabs (items 005A1 through 005A4) were present and retained as item 005A. Presumptive chemical testing indicated the possible presence of blood. No confirmatory testing was performed at this time.

## Item 005A

The DNA profile obtained from one swab (item 005A1) was interpreted as originating from a single individual. The probability of the evidence has been calculated by considering the following propositions:

- H1: The profile originated from Eric Logan (item 009A).  
H2: The profile originated from an unknown, unrelated individual.

The DNA profile is at least 1 trillion times more likely if it originated from Eric Logan than if it originated from an unknown, unrelated individual. This analysis provides very strong support for the proposition that Eric Logan is a contributor to the DNA profile.

Leigh Robison (item 011A), Katy Harris (item 012A), Evan Fisher (item 013A), and Ryan O'Neill (item 014A) were excluded as contributors to the DNA profile.

No DNA analysis was performed on three additional swabs (items 005A2, 005A3, and 005A4) at this time.

**Item 006**

**Car radio face plate:** One sample from the knob (item 006A1), one sample from the trim (item 006A2), and one sample from the face plate (item 006A3) were retained as item 006A.

- Item 006A Three samples (Items 006A1, 006A2, and 006A3) failed to demonstrate a sufficient quantity of DNA for further analysis.
- Item 007** **Car radio faceplate trim:** No blood was detected by presumptive chemical testing. One sample was retained as item 007A.
- Item 007A The sample failed to demonstrate a sufficient quantity of DNA for further analysis.
- Item 009** **Standard - Eric Logan:** A stain card was present and retained as item 009A.
- Item 009A The DNA profile obtained was used for comparison purposes.
- Item 011** **Standard - Leigh Robison:** Two swabs were present and retained as item 011A.
- Item 011A The DNA profile obtained was used for comparison purposes.
- Item 012** **Standard - Katy Harris:** Two swabs were present and retained as item 012A.
- Item 012A The DNA profile obtained was used for comparison purposes.
- Item 013** **Standard - Evan Fisher:** Two swabs were present and retained as item 013A.
- Item 013A The DNA profile obtained was used for comparison purposes.
- Item 014** **Standard - Ryan O'Neill:** Two swabs were present and retained as item 014A.
- Item 014A The DNA profile obtained was used for comparison purposes.

In the DNA analysis detailed above, profiles were developed using Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) with the PowerPlex® Fusion 6C System by Promega Corporation.

The propositions presented in this report are based upon the case information provided. If an additional set of propositions should be considered, please contact the reporting analyst. If all parties agree that the DNA profile originated from the same individual(s), or if there is equal support for both propositions, the likelihood ratio would equal 1. A likelihood ratio of 1 is uninformative.

Y-STR loci included with the PowerPlex® Fusion 6C System were used for

interpretations, but were not included in statistical estimates. Calculations for the Caucasian, African American, Hispanic, and Asian populations have been performed. The lowest likelihood ratio has been reported unless all calculated likelihood ratios exceed 1 trillion.

The statistical calculations are reported in conjunction with a verbal qualifying statement used to express the strength of statistical support. These statements follow the verbal scale recommended by the Scientific Working Group on DNA Analysis Methods (7/12/18). The scale reflects stronger degrees of support as the likelihood ratio increases in magnitude.

officer then shot the individual. The shooting victim was later identified as Eric Logan. After being shot, Eric threw the knife at the officer, striking him in the arm. Eric was immediately rushed to the hospital, but ultimately died from his injuries. Upon further investigation it was learned that several vehicles were broken into overnight and several items from those vehicles were located in the crime scene. Further note, it was raining all morning and all the evidence located at the scene was rained on. They were later dried in a controlled environment. Also, it is believed that Eric Logan had an abrasion on his hand prior to the shooting.



**RESULTS/OPINIONS/INTERPRETATIONS:**

The pistol in item 003 was examined for functional defects and test fired. No functional defects were observed.

The three magazines in item 003 seated and functioned in the pistol in item 003.



**CERTIFICATE OF ANALYSIS**

Examination of the fifty cartridges in item 003 revealed them to be 9mm Luger cartridges typical of those manufactured by or marketed as Federal. Six of the fifty cartridges were test fired in the pistol in item 003. The test fired ammunition components will be returned to the contributor as item 003T. It is recommended that these test fires be retained for a period of at least five years.


Examination of the coat in 001 and the t-shirt in item 002 revealed corresponding defects in the right chest area of the garments. The areas around the defects were visually, microscopically, and chemically examined for the presence of gunshot residues. No gunshot residues were detected in the areas around the defects. Due to the lack of such residues a muzzle-to-garment distance could not be determined.

Three pieces of black plastic (one with an attached glass like fragment), one penny, a folded paper interim identification card, a small fragment of green vegetation, and salt like trace material were found in the interior of the hem of the coat in item 001. An additional small fragment of green vegetation, similar to the one found in the hem, was found on examination paper beneath the coat during examination. The found items were sub-itemed as 001A and will be retained by the laboratory for possible future analysis or returned to the contributor.
